- **7. Brief on the project along with the present status:** The project was monitored on 21st July, 2022 by this office. Mr. Ajit Chate Env. officer, Mr. M. R. Patil Chief Chemist (Distillery), Dr. B. Subbarao Environment Consultant and other staffs of the project were present during the inspection. The Additional documents/information sought during the site visit were submitted by the PA on 14th October, 2022.
- **Environment Clearance:** Initially, the project was established in the year 1961 with crushing capacity of 1250 TCD. Thereafter, PA has expanded 5000 TCD Sugarcane crushing capacity. EC obtained from Ministry vide No. J-13011/6/2006-IA II(I) dated 25.07.2006 for 41MW cogeneration unit. Subsequently, PA has obtained EC from Ministry vide letter J-11011/54/2009-IA II(I) dated 9th April, 2009 for Expansion of Sugar Mill Capacity from 5000 TCD to 11,000 TCD, Modernization and expansion of distillery capacity from 54 KLPD to 84 KLPD and expansion of Co-generation capacity from 41 MW to 52 MW and establishment of 30 KLPD ENA/Ethanol plant.

During the visit, PA informed that the management has expanded sugarcane crushing capacity from 5000 TCD to 8000 TCD and co-generation capacity from 41MW to 52 MW and remaining activities are yet to be established (Modernization and expansion of distillery capacity from 54 KLPD to 84 KLPD and establishment of 30 KLPD ENA / Ethanol plant).

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- ii. Consent for operation: PA has obtained Consent for operation from KSPCB Vide No AW-332708 / PCBID 12690 dated 8th August, 2022 which is valid till 30th June, 2023 for discharge of effluents under the Water (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act 1974 and Emissions under the Air (Prevention and Control of Pollution) Act 1981.
- iii. <u>Environmental Safeguards:</u> During the visit, it is observed that the Sugar, Co-gen and distillery plants are not in operation stage as crushing season completed in April, 2022. Further, it was noted form the visit as well as from the records that PA has taken several steps for environmental safeguards, as follows:
 - 1. <u>Air Pollution Control:</u> During the visit, it was noted that PA has installed High efficiency ESP for controlling the stack emission from the 2x100 TPH co-generation boiler followed by stack of 85 M and ESP for controlling the stack emission from for 20 TPH distillery boiler followed by stack of 47 M. As per the latest report, stack emissions are well within the prescribed limits. It was noted that PA has monitoring three stations (ETP Plant, Factory Main gate and IB Hall) for ambient air quality identified in consultation with KSPCB officers in the downwind direction, as well as where maximum ground level concentration of SPM, SO2, Nox, are anticipated. Regular monthly monitoring is being carried out and the reports are submitted to KSPCB and this office. As per the latest Ambient Air Quality Monitoring report all the parameters are within permissible limits. It was noted that PA has provided acoustic enclosures for 750 KVA DG set.
 - 2. Wastewater Management: During the visit, it was noted that Effluent Treatment Plant (800 KLD capacity) in under maintenance stage. Based on the records, around 540 KL/day of spent wash was generated from this unit during 2020-21. They are carrying out biocomposting of their spent wash along with press mud & boiler ash. Thus, PA has ensured that all the effluents are consumed within the premises and there is no discharge of effluent outside the factory premises. Based on the records, the treated Sugar & Co-generation effluents are used for green belt development. It was noted that online water analyzer (pH, TSS, COD, BOD) installed at the outlet of the effluent treatment plant and connected to KSPCB and CPCB server. Further, PA has monitored regularly through third party laboratory and submitted the analysis reports to this office and KSPCB/CPCB. As per the latest monitoring reports, the parameters are within the prescribed limits. It was noted that domestic effluent is disposed in soak pits.
 - 3. <u>Solid Waste Management:</u> Based on the records, about 2,11,313 MT of press mud and 3265 MT of fly ash were generated and bio-composting with spent wash, same were given to farmers on free of cost or subsidy cost. No storage has been seen on the day of inspection.
 - 4. Green Belt development: Based on the records, total plot area is 81.15 Ha. Out of 81.15 Ha, PA has developed greenbelt about 16.2 Ha (40 acres) where under 24,000 Nos. of trees are planted in industrial premises, around bagasse yard, water tank, administration building, avenue plantation, shelter belt plantation which include trees like Tectona grandis, Ficus recemosa, Terminalia elliptica, Pongamia pinnata, Delonix regia, Azadirachta indica, Acacia sp, Manilkara zapota, Sesbania grandiflora (Shewarie), Terminalia catappa, Polyalthia longifolia (Ashok), Conocarpous sp., Silver oak, Cassia fistula etc. Based on the documents submitted by PA and physical observation during the site visit, it was noted that PA has not achieved 33% of green belt development area.

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5. Environment Management Cell: Based on the documents, PA have a separate Environment Management cell with a person qualified in the field of Environmental and an environmental laboratory has been set up for the Environmental management & monitoring functions. As per the records, Rs 29 Crores of capital cost has been spent towards environment and pollution control measures so far. Rs 5.5 Crores for recurring cost.

The following Non-compliances are observed during the visit:

- 1. PA has not developed company website and not uploaded a copy of EC and compliance report with monitoring data (Sp Conditions No v & General condition No x).
- PA has not achieved 33% of green belt development area as per the EC conditions (Specific Conditions No – vii).

<u>General observation:</u> During the visit, it was noted that PA has not provided black top/ RCC for internal roads. PA has been advised to provided black top /RCC for roads.

During the visit, PA has informed that they are planning to expand the sugar cane crushing capacity from 8000 TCD to 11000 TCD and distillery capacity from 54 KLPD to 100KLPD to manufacture 100 KLPD RS/ 100 KLPD Ethanol based on C- Molasses/ B heavy — Molasses/Sugar Cane juice/Sugar syrup/Grains to produce Ethanol for meeting the National Demand of Bioethanol under the Ethanol Blending Program (EBP). As per the Ministry Notification vide No. S.O. 2339(E) dated 16th June, 2021 the project activity comes under category 'B2'. The PA has sought the certified compliance report from this office for the proposed expansion of the distillery and sugar cane crushing capacity. Accordingly, monitoring of the project was carried out.

Based on the physical observation and records made available, detailed compliance status to different conditions of the environmental clearance is given in this report.




Fig 1. Google Earth Map at Project area.




Fig. 2. Sugar plant of M/s. Hiranyakeshi Sahakari Sakkare Karkhane Niyamit, Sankeshwar.

During the visit, PA has informed that distillery expansion is yet be taken place and not Implemented continuous fermentation technology. It was noted that the existing distillery is adopted batch type fermentation technology. Based on the records, around 540 KL/day of spent wash was generated from this unit during 2020-21. They are carrying out bio-composting of their spent wash along with press mud & boiler ash. Thus, PA has ensured that all the effluents are consumed within the premises and there is no discharge of effluent outside the factory premises.

During the visit, it was noted that PA has provided garland canal around the compost yard. During the visit, it was noted that distillery is closed for monsoon season, it was informed that after closing their distillery unit during Monsoon, the generated spent wash was used for composting work in their compost yard.




Fig.3. Compost yard

Based on the records, the treated Sugar & Cogeneration effluents are used for green belt development. It was noted that PA has monitored regularly through third party laboratory and submitted the analysis reports to this office and KSPCB/CPCB. As per the latest monitoring reports, the parameters are within the prescribed limits. Domestic effluent is disposed in soak pits.

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ii) The spent wash shall be stored in impervious pucca lagoons. The spentwash lagoons shall have proper lining with HDPE and shall be kept in proper condition to prevent ground water pollution. As per the CPCB guidelines storage for the spent wash and treated effluent for sugar unit shall not exceed 15days capacity.

Based on the records submitted by PA and during the visit, it was noted that, PA has provided two (2x2500 KLD) impervious pucca lagoons made with proper HDPE lining as per CPCB norms for storing the raw spent wash, it was informed that the spent wash will be used for bio digester within the 15 days storage capacity.




Fig.4. Spent wash lagoons at project area.

iii) Adequate number of Ground water quantity monitoring stations by providing piezometers around the project area and compost yard shall be set up sampling and trend analysis shall be carried on a monthly basis and shall be submitted to the KSPCB and the Ministry.

During the visit, it was noted that PA has installed six piezometers around the project area as well as on the downstream side of compost yard and storage lagoons. As per the latest ground water analysis report, no contamination has been noticed and the results are submitted to this office.

iv) Particulate emissions from the 200TPH boilers shall be controlled by wet scrubber/ESP and emissions shall be dispersed through adequate stack height as per CPCB guidelines. The D.G. sets shall be provided with acoustic enclosure to mitigate the noise pollution and emissions shall be dispersed through adequate stack height as per CPCB guidelines.

During the visit, it was noted that PA has installed High efficiency ESP for controlling the stack emission from the 2x100 TPH co-generation boiler followed by stack of 85 M and ESP for controlling the stack emission from for 20 TPH distillery boiler followed by stack of 47 M. As per the latest report, stack emissions are well within the prescribed limits. It was noted that PA has provided acoustic enclosures for 750 KVA DG set.
